The death of your child is probably the most traumatic, life-changing event that you will ever experience. The Compassionate Friends is an organization of parents who have also lost a child to death. Each of us has experienced the deep, searing pain that you are feeling now. Each of us has turned to other parents who were farther into their grief journey for guidance, support and understanding. This is done through our monthly meetings, our newsletter, our website, our Telephone Friend program, our library and our e-Each month parents find our mail program. meeting to be a safe place where they can talk about their pain and problems with others who are uniquely qualified to understand; bereaved parents offer gentle suggestions or often simply listen. We invite you to bring a friend to your first few meetings until you feel a level of comfort with the group. Do not be surprised if we talk about the happy times with our children, the wonderful memories and the various methods we have created to keep our children close to us. It is here that many bereaved parents find hope as those who are more seasoned in their grief shine the light of experience to help illuminate each grief path. We have no dues. We are self-sustaining through donations and the generosity of so many in our community.

At nearly every meeting we welcome new members to our group, always with mixed emotions. We are glad you found us, but we are so sorry for the circumstances that bring us together. We understand your pain; we hope our unconditional friendship and understanding will help you through your grief. Attending a meeting for the first two or three times takes courage, but for many it is the first real step toward healing. It may seem overwhelming, so we encourage you to come to several meetings to give yourself a chance to become comfortable.

## **LEVEL ORANGE**

What does Level Orange mean and how will it affect our meeting?

El Paso County is currently at "Safer at Home" Level Orange which means a further tightening up of group and business rules concerning Covid-19.

Our meeting place can remain open but we are required to limit the attendance of our group meetings to 25% of our population or 50 people whichever is LESS. We will have to cap our meetings at **13 people** which does not include our facilitator or staff members.

We will require all participants to wear their masks throughout the meeting for everyones safety. There will be no exceptions. This is a change from previous meeting where we could remove our masks once we were seated. Please bring your own water bottle.

As a result of these new guidelines, we will require all participants to pre-register prior to our meeting. Thank you for your understanding and cooperation.
