FOR SURVIVING BROTHERS & SISTERS: RE-ENTERING SCHOOL AFTER THE DEATH OF A SIBLING

Going back to school after the death of your brother or sister is a hard thing to go through. At first there are three groups of people to deal with: people who give you a lot of support, people who don't know what to say, and those who give you weird looks and stay away from you. This last for a little while.

After a short time, changes occur with each group; those who didn't know what to say start to speak or begin to talk, the group who kept away stop ignoring you, and the people who gave you a lot of support slowly return to their own affairs. After about a month and a half, everything goes back to normal and is over for everyone except you. This is very difficult to accept and makes you feel all the more alone.

After awhile the shock for you goes away, and it is then that you need support from your friends, peers and teachers. This month is the first anniversary of the death of my brother. Most people will have forgotten and think everything is right with the world. But it is not! Certainly not to my mother and me.

STEPS TO MAKING PROGRESS

Allow yourself

- To be imperfect
- Whatever brings you pleasure and a little peace

Force Yourself

- To keep communication open
- To accept offers of help from family or friends
 - To go through the old routines again
 - To really listen to your spouse and children
 - To try an activity you used to enjoy

Convince Yourself

- That every member of your family will and should grieve differently
 - That you won't feel dead inside forever
 - That your confusion about intimacy with your spouse is normal

Let Yourself

- Off the hook for problems
 - Feel the anger
- Treasure your special friends

Teach Yourself

- To establish small goals
- Everything you can learn about grief
- To ignore well-intentioned, unhelpful comments of others.
 - To let go of the moment of your loved one's death.
 - To embrace the memories of your loved one.

Talk to Yourself

- To change the negative ways you think
 - About everything

Forgive Yourself

- For not being the most perfect parent or sibling
 - For all the things that you did or did not do

Find Yourself

- Now that you have changed into a different person
 - Without relying on drugs, alcohol, etc.
- By relying on positive techniques (reading, writing, new hobby)

Indulge Yourself

- By being selfish and doing something just for you
 - Because you deserve it

Express Yourself

- By talking out your feelings
- In a safe atmosphere, such as TCF
 - Through a new activity

Forget Yourself & Give of Yourself

- By seeking out other bereaved parents and siblings and others in trouble
 - By concentrating on others who are not in pain
 - To discover that We Need Not Walk Alone
 - As a tribute to your loved one


